

Offered to special primary school students:

Dear parents/guardians,

During the summer holidays from 10th July to 18th August 2023, the City of Vienna is offering free **summer German courses for Viennese pupils** as part of the “**WienerSommerLernen**” initiative.

These summer German courses are run by the Department of Education for the City of Vienna and Interface Vienna. The aim of the summer German courses is to improve your child’s German language skills so that your child has a good start into the 2023/24 school year.

What are the summer German courses?

Summer German courses are German courses that are educationally tailored to your child and their age group and school level. A summer German course lasts 2 weeks and takes place from 8.30 a.m. – 11.30 a.m. Monday to Friday. A maximum of 16 students are supervised in one group. Excursions and field trips are also planned into the course design. The German courses allow the children to interact with each other and learn together in small groups

Who can join?

Your child can attend the summer German course if he or she

- 1.) is registered as residing in Vienna
- 2.) attends a Viennese primary school (grades 0-4) and
- 3.) is referred to as an außerordentliche*r Schüler*in (a special student).

The summer German course will help your child to speak and write German even better in the next school year!

If your child attends the course regularly, he/she will receive a course certificate. The course confirmation allows for a reassessment of your child’s German language skills to be carried out within the first two weeks of school (with the test MIKA-D) as an exception. The result of the assessment shall determine the level of German language support provided at the school. If you have any questions about this, please contact your child’s school.

When do the summer German courses take place?

The summer German courses take place Monday to Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. on the following three dates:

10th July – 21st July	24th July – 4th August	7th August – 18th August
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How much do the summer German courses cost?

The summer German courses are provided **free of charge** by the City of Vienna!

Do I need anything for the registration?

To register for the German course, you'll need a **confirmation from your child's school management (with the stamp from the management)**.
